This year's Peer Summit will again be held at College of Marin in Kentfield, offering both expanded opportunity for occupancy and workshop sessions, as well as a collegiate experience for the expected 400 P.S. participants. Morning entertainment and addresses will be followed by **TWO** morning break-out sessions (9:45-10:45 and 11:00-12:00), with students self-selecting which workshops they attend. **AGAIN THIS YEAR:** All participants will enjoy a performance by an educational drama troupe in the College's Fine Arts Performing Hall in place of a third (afternoon) session of workshops.
